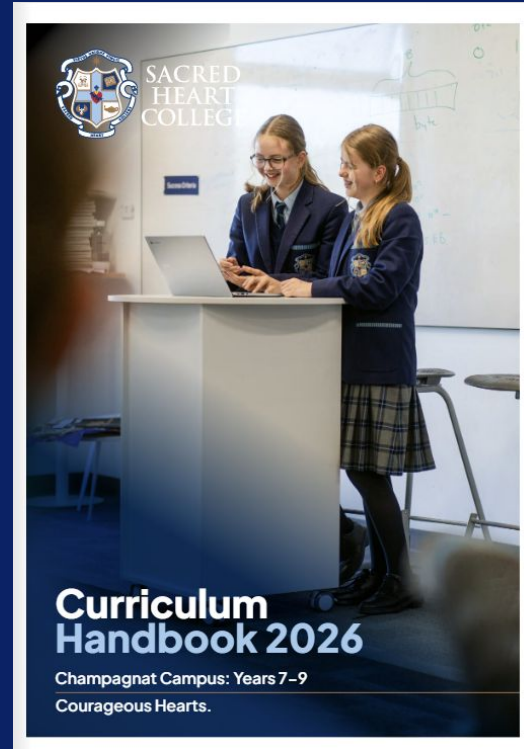


Curriculum Handbook

Music

- There are a range of ensembles to cater for all abilities and interests: Drumline, Choir, Rock Bands, Guitar Band, Super Band (auditioned), Concert Band and Liturgy Band.
- Rehearsals are weekly and are held before school, during break times and after school, depending on the ensemble.
- Students are recommended to be receiving instrumental tuition on the instrument that they play in their band.
- Students can start instrumental tuition at the college and their instrumental tutor will recommend when they are ready to join an ensemble.
- All ensembles will perform at various college and community events throughout the year.
- Students can be in more than one ensemble as long as they have assessed their ability to commit to rehearsals and to practise the music in between.



Sports and Clubs

- College Sports Policy
- Recommendation of one sport per season (summer and winter).
- Commitment to one training per week.
- Nominations for summer sport commencing in Term 1 assume a commitment to the same sport in Term 4 also.
- Nominations for winter sports will be sent out to families early in Term 1, 2026.
- Parents are responsible for providing transport to all sports, with the exception of knockout sport competitions which are held during the school day.
- All students are placed in a team for their nominated sport and all ability levels are catered for. Trials will occur to inform the nomination of appropriate grades.

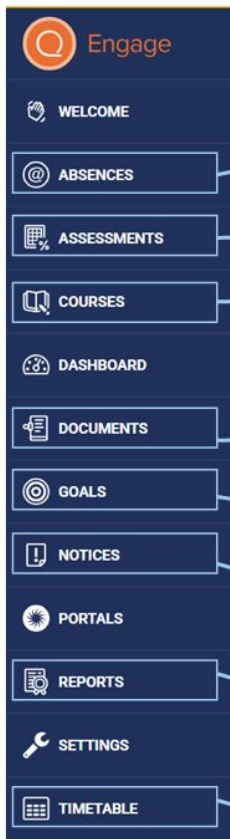

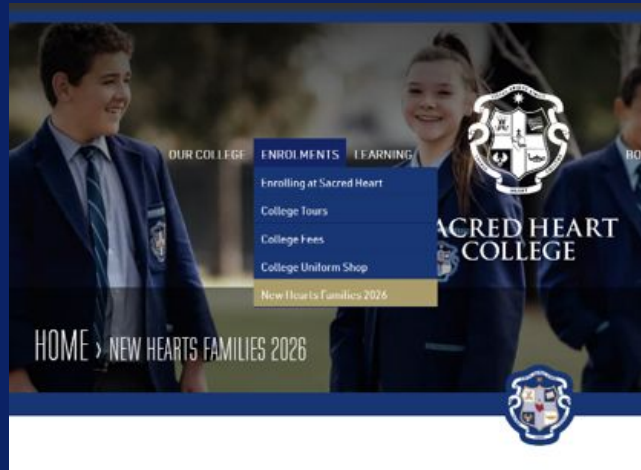
Key role of the P&F Committee:
